



Farewell Dr. Rachel Jones

Rachel Jones PhD, RN, FAAN

Dr. Jones has made extraordinary contributions to the science of nursing. She has been awarded several NIH grants to support her research; she was funded by the National Institute for Nursing Research (NIRN) in an RO3 formative study, two RO1 clinical trials, and an



information systems research grant (GO8) from the National Library of Medicine. Her research has followed a trajectory of exploring relationship-based concerns among women at high HIV risk, communicating HIV prevention through the drama of the soap opera web series video format, globally understood as entertainment education. Love, Sex, and Choices were used as an approach to reduce the HIV sex risk in urban women.

In recognition of her commitment to excellence in nursing science and public health, Dr. Jones was inducted as a Fellow at the American Academy of Nursing in 2010. She was appointed to the Advisory Committee of the Office of Research on Women's Health (ORWH) at the National Institute of Health and served from 9/2016 to 9/2019 and is a former recipient of the Nurse Educator of the New York Times Tribute to Nurses award.

We all recognize Dr. Jones for her unconditional dedication, grace, and congeniality. It is for these outstanding qualities and the accomplishments that Dr. Jones was selected to be the inaugural School of Nursing Assistant Dean of Research. Her research and pioneering mentorship have served as a great inspiration to us all. During the past year, she has led the SON through growth and positive change. She has leveraged her prolific work and experiential wisdom to build a community of scholarship among our clinical and research scholars.
