- **APPLICANT MUST DEMONSTRATE TALENT AND POTENTIAL:**

Talent & Achievement Consideration - Applicant must demonstrate:

A definite talent or potential for achievement in architecture, supported by official school transcript, personal statement essay, and a submitted *portfolio of student projects and design work (copies acceptable)*;

9) **Portfolio of Student Projects and Examples of Design Work:**

The submission of a portfolio is an important component of the application. The portfolio shall consist of a selection of current student design work. The intention is to show a range of work and to explain the objectives of the design assignment. Submit reproduction copies (not originals).

- a) Format: Submit as 8-1/2" x 11" or 11" x 17" size; (color xeroxes are acceptable).
- b) Content: Show a variety of design work (minimum 5 pages, maximum 20 pages).
- c) Design Display: The emphasis of the portfolio should be on showing your creativity, design skills, professionalism, how you solved challenging design problems, and areas of special interest to you. Portfolio should be well organized, visually interesting, and informative.
- d) Identification: Identify what the work represents. (Note: Briefly written descriptions of the goals or design objectives of the projects help reviewers fully understand the work).
- e) Variety: Work can include a sample display of architectural studio projects along with reproductions of artwork, drawings, photography, models, furniture or craft projects.

PORTFOLIO OPTION: As an option, the portfolio submission may comprise a *presentation of your TWO most recent student projects*. These two projects must be thoroughly documented (and not just be excerpted pieces of projects). This alternate submittal must be comprehensive and represent the full progression of work from initial conceptual sketches through design development images to finished presentation drawings. It is important to show design talent and mastery of a range of mixed media (by incorporating use of artwork, models, photographs, crafts, etc.)

- **APPLICANT MUST INDICATE INTEREST AND COMMITMENT:**

Interest & Commitment to Architecture - Applicant must: Indicate interest and commitment in pursuing an architectural career in New Jersey after schooling is completed; (personal statement should describe intentions for contributing to NJ's built environment); Applicant must demonstrate outstanding character traits through personal statement which includes a brief description of goals, aspirations, and challenges in life. References to extra-curricular activities, jobs, and interests are helpful in describing applicant's character.

10) **Personal Statement Essay:**

On separate sheet(s), please type a **personal statement essay** (minimum one page). This essay is important to the selection process, because it gives reviewers an opportunity to learn about the applicant from a highly personalized viewpoint different from application and transcript records.

- Include:*
- a) Your personal goals, interests, aspirations, character traits, and challenges in your life;
 - b) Your extra-curricular activities and jobs that have enriched your life and experiences;
 - c) Your Honors, Awards, and Recognized Talents (academic and non-academic);
 - d) Your interest in architecture including any special interests or cultural experiences;
 - e) Your commitment to architecture in NJ including how you plan to use your architectural education. Specifically, note how you intend to put your architectural education to use and indicate how it may benefit or contribute to architectural design work in New Jersey.

11) **Supplemental documents required:**

- a) Transcript of undergraduate and graduate college record to date shall be sent directly.
- b) Completed Federal form for Financial Student Aid (the F.A.F.S.A.) shall be sent for the current school year (available from the College Entrance Examination Board).

- c) **OPTIONAL: One to Two Letters of Reference** may be submitted with sender’s name, title, & phone number. (If two letters, then one reference should be from a teacher or professor; the second reference from a professional, employer, or friend - NOT a relative.)
NOTE: The submission of any Letter of Recommendation is OPTIONAL.

- c) **EVALUATION CRITERIA:** Board of Trustees of AIA New Jersey Scholarship Foundation will award scholarship grants on the basis of an applicant’s demonstration of *connection to NJ, scholastic achievement, financial need, demonstrated architectural talent, assessed potential for achievement in architecture and personal vision for contributing to NJ’s built environment.*

Applicants will be judged on the basis of 100 points with the following distribution:

- Total 30 Points **Academic Achievement Information** including grades is based on *School transcript* and years from first professional degree;
- Total 30 Points **Financial Assistance Information** including family support is based on Family assistance, special circumstances, self-help income from school-term & summer-time jobs, dependent expenses, etc.
- Total 30 Points **Design Talent & Potential for Achievement** is based upon the submitted *portfolio* of design work including a review of the quality of design projects, expressed design talents and potential, presentation form, clarity, variety of work, and use of different media; plus optional letters of reference.
- Total 10 Points **Interest & Commitment to Architecture** is based upon the submitted *personal statement essay* including the expression of personal goals, character traits, general interests, talents, extra curricular activities, challenges in life, special areas of interest in architecture, and vision on how to use architectural education to improve architecture & planning in New Jersey.
