Curriculum for the College of Science

This course map outlines the academic program of study, per college and major, for students attending the Fall N.U.in Program. Students will register for classes in Summer 2022 and will meet with their Northeastern academic advising office to finalize their course selections before program departure. All students will be enrolled in a full course-load. See credits below. *Please note, all courses may be subject to change.*

- **Academic Advising.** Your course selections are designed to match the curriculum for your chosen major. You will have the opportunity to discuss your course selections, AP/IB/transfer credit, and more during your summer advising session.
- Add/drop. Once class begins, students may request a course change with their host institution during their add/drop period.
 However, students are discouraged from adding or dropping courses once they arrive on site because NU academic advising
 has already carefully reviewed, discussed, and confirmed fall classes. Any changes that students make to their course
 registration after they arrive on site may negatively impact their academic progress, so it is not recommended.

Course Registration Process

- Step 1. April-May. Review course maps and course description guides on GEO website.
- Step 2. Early June. Students make their initial course selections via their Application Status Check portal.
- Step 3. June through July. Students review course selections with their Northeastern academic advising office to finalize fall classes.
 - O Your northeastern academic advising office will connect with you this summer to discuss academic planning; namely, the courses you need/want to take during your fall N.U.in semester.
 - Please be sure to check your Northeastern email regularly, as updates and outreach will be going to your Husky email address.
 - O Please also note that each college may have a different procedure for reaching out to students. We assure you that you will have the opportunity to connect with your Northeastern academic advising office to review, discuss, and ultimately, confirm your final classes for the fall N.U.in semester.
- Step 4. Early August. Final classes are confirmed by Northeastern with partner institutions.
 - No further changes to course selections until add/drop- once students arrive on site.
- **Step 5. August & September.** Programs launch and students arrive.
 - Once class begins, students may request a course change during their host institution's add/drop period. Be sure to check your host institution's academic calendar during on-site orientation.
 - Course selections have already been reviewed and confirmed by your Northeastern academic college, so *course changes are strongly discouraged*. Any changes that students make to their course registration may negatively impact
 their academic progress.
 - Course changes are not guaranteed. Due to host institution class capacity and timetabling considerations, changes may not be possible.
