 - Good neighbor responsibilities






What We Do





Did You Know?

- No more than 4 undergrads can share an apartment in Boston.
- Landlords can charge 1st month's rent, last month's rent and a security deposit, all before move in day.
- Leases in Boston are for 1 year (Sept 1- Aug 31) and are legally binding.
- Co-signers are required and are "equally & severally" obligated to terms.

Finding an Apartment

- Use the Off Campus Housing Database to find apartments and roommates.
 - Aptsearch.northeastern.edu
- 2. Contact a realtor or landlord listed on the database.
 - Reputable realtors in the area
- 3. Look at several different apartments before deciding.
 - ❖ NEVER sign a lease without seeing the apartment first.
 - READ the entire lease (or have OCSS read the lease) BEFORE you sign it

Use a Good Realtor...

- Listed on our Housing Database
- Physical office location
- Answers your questions & explains fees
- Shows actual, available properties
- Good standing with Better Business Bureau
- Passes the "gut test"

Be Prepared To...

Pay these 4 fees

- First month's rent
- Last month's rent
- Security deposit (no more than 1 month's rent)
- Realtor fee (no more than 1 month's rent)

Get signed copy of lease

One Time Expenses vs. Monthly Expenses

- Last month rent
- Security deposit
- Realtor fee
- Furniture
- Installation fees
- Moving expenses

- Rent
- Utilities electricity, heat, hot water
- Transportation gas, MBTA, parking
- Cable, internet

Other Considerations

- Pick roommate(s) carefully!
- Does financial aid award apply?
- Unfurnished is the norm
- One time vs monthly expenses



Components of a Lease

- Name, address, contact info of landlord
- All names on lease
- Amount of rent and date due
- Lease start and end date
- Name and contact info for repairs
- Addendum the landlord's "extra" rules

What you can do!

- 1. Talk to your student about the housing search process.
 - Where are they looking?
 - What is the realtor like?
 - What does the apartment look like?
- 2. Have they read the lease? Be a second set of eyes!
 - Encourage them to come see us to read it! Lease Genius
 - Any illegal fees or clauses in the addendum? Other concerns?
- 3. Look at the apartment!
 - Out of town? Have your student send photos?
 - Is it up to code?
 - Fire Safety working smoke detectors, 2 exits from every bedroom.
